## President's Message Jackie Littleton

I joined the Tyler branch of AAUW 44 years ago. A friend invited me. I joined two interest groups--arts and crafts and creative writing. I don't remember ever going to a branch meeting, but I do remember making hundreds of ornaments to decorate one of the many Christmas trees that adorned the houses on the Holiday Home Tour. There were almost 500 members and I never met more than a handful.

As we moved from place to place, I always looked for an AAUW branch, and eventually I discovered that AAUW had a mission. We studied things. In a few branches, that's all we did. Some of the branches were marching in the streets for civil rights and women's rights and the ERA. Some were having tea parties, but all were having fun.

Why did you join AAUW? The question has been asked: what do we get for our membership? Our membership vice president, Susan Garrison, has a good answer: we get the satisfaction of knowing we help women and girls go to college or complete their dissertation; we work to achieve pay equity; we support legislation that levels the playing field (even in soccer); we study the issues and make informed decisions; we discuss books that we might never have discovered; and, best of all, we make new friends who share our love of life-long learning.

No, we don't get free admission to something or a choice parking spot. We don't get our names on a plaque somewhere. No buildings are going to be named for us. You

can get a membership card, but you have to print it yourself. But I hope you value your membership and want to invite a new member to join us. I look forward to an exciting year as we make some structural changes and, next year, celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our right to vote. Please come to our 2019-2020 Kickoff and get involved.

I'm adopting a quote from Representative Jeannette Rankin of Montana, the first woman elected to Congress, as my motto for the year: *Today, as never before, the Nation needs its women—needs the work of their hands and their hearts and their minds.* **Jackie**

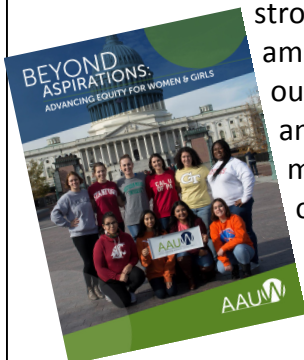

This year's NVRD will be held on September 24.

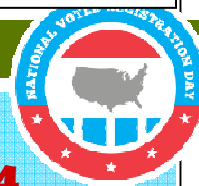

# Volunteer Deputy Registrar Training Opportunities



To become a **Volunteer Deputy Voter Registrar, (VDR)** you have 2 options in Smith County. The first option is to attend **in-person training** at the Smith County Elections Office (304 E. Ferguson). The second is to watch the **online** VDR training prepared by the state of Texas. Information regarding the two options is described below.

## In-Person Training

Regarding **in-person training**, Debbie Taylor will set up a training with Karen Nelson at the Smith County Elections Office when their staff return on August 5. The date for the training will be August 13 – planning for 1:30PM at the Elections Office, pending confirmation with Karen.

## Online Training

The other option is the **online training**. See the instructions printed next for this option.

**Use** this state government link: <https://www.sos.texas.gov/elections/forms/volunteer-deputy-registrar-training.pdf>

- **Print** the PDF training (you may use it during your examination at the Elections Office). Follow the guidelines below to complete the training and to receive your VDR certification.

## Guidelines:

Smith County allows for online VDR training. To do this, a person must review/read the SOS online Volunteer Deputy Registrar training. Upon completing the training, they must appear in person in the voter registrar's office to take an examination. Upon satisfactory completion of the examination, and completion of the Request of Appointment, the voter registrar must appoint the person as a VDR. They will be issued a Certificate of Appointment. As this time, the county can provide the newly appointed VDR of any county specific procedures. The voter registrar must advise the newly appointed volunteer deputy registrar that the only requirements for voter registration are those prescribed by state law or by the Secretary of State.

## Examination

The **examination** is "open-book." A potential VDR can use the training materials to assist them when completing the examination. A potential VDR is required to answer at least 90% (18 of 20) of the examination questions to successfully complete the application. The Election Code does not provide a limit to the number of times a potential VDR can take the examination before passing.

If you decide to do the online training and then take the exam at the Elections Office, please let Debbie know when you've successfully completed it so you can be added to the roster of certified VDRs.

### ★ Congratulations to the following women students awarded AAUW scholarships at Annual Meeting ★

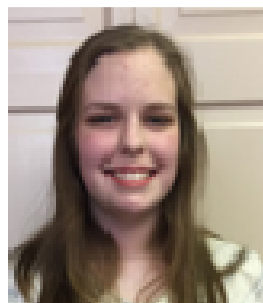

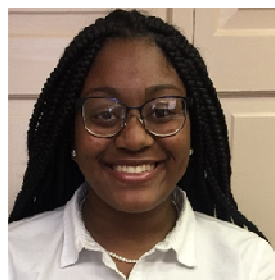

Program, serving as competition team captain and culinary president. She plans to major in biology at Texas A & M University to start her journey of becoming an ER Doctor.

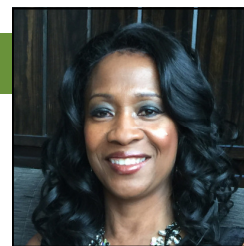

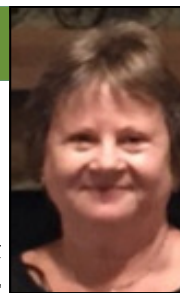
