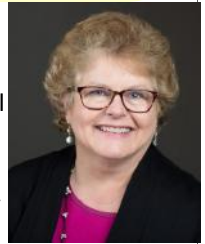

AAUW-Tyler President Gives View of the Group's Beginnings



AAUW's story began in 1881, when a small group of female college graduates banded together to open the doors for women's career advancement and to encourage more women to pursue higher education. AAUW contributed to Marie Curie so she could purchase a gram of radium for her research, and during WWII AAUW supported the establishment of women's units of the armed services and advocated

for equal pay and rank.

Our local branch was started in 1931 and contributed to the War Relief Fund and undertook bandage rolling during the war years to support the troops. Child development through fine art and reading programs also were some of its early programs.

The legacy of these early efforts led to AAUW-Tyler accomplishments today.

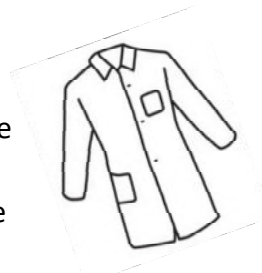

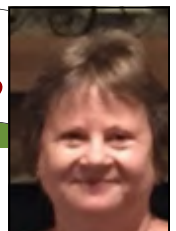

Overall, AAUW National has given more than \$135 million to over 13,000

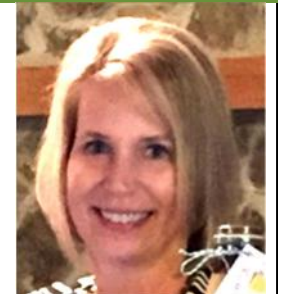
